Toronto Declaration

The Toronto declaration is a call from the medical community for coordinated action by governments, industry, affected individuals, and healthcare providers to address the many challenges that continue to impede global control and ultimate eradication of viral hepatitis.

The present declaration outlines specific public health policies and interventions with tangible but achievable goals that we hope will help guide WHO and national governments as they continue to develop strategies to address viral hepatitis locally, nationally and on a global scale.

Diagnosing

Including lectures on WHO guidelines and Policies of testing, progress in technologies and a lecture by Dr Isabelle Andrieux-Meyer (Médecins Sans Frontières) on **Challenges in Monitoring (POC)**.

Reducing Transmission and Harm

This session is focused on how to reduce transmission and harm in the context of elimination. Plenary lectures include a.o. a lecture on the **Global Injection Prevention WHO** and a lecture on **creating awareness and sharing the knowledge**.

Future scenarios for elimination

The last session of the meeting will focus on scenarios for elimination of viral hepatitis. *Dr Andrew Hill (Liverpool University)* will give a plenary lecture on the **Role of generics** and *Dr John Ward (CDC)* will give a talk on **Building global capacity**.
